The staff will enforce all N-SSA Skirmish Rules. It is your responsibility to be familiar with and comply with the rules governing safe firing practice and approved uniforms.

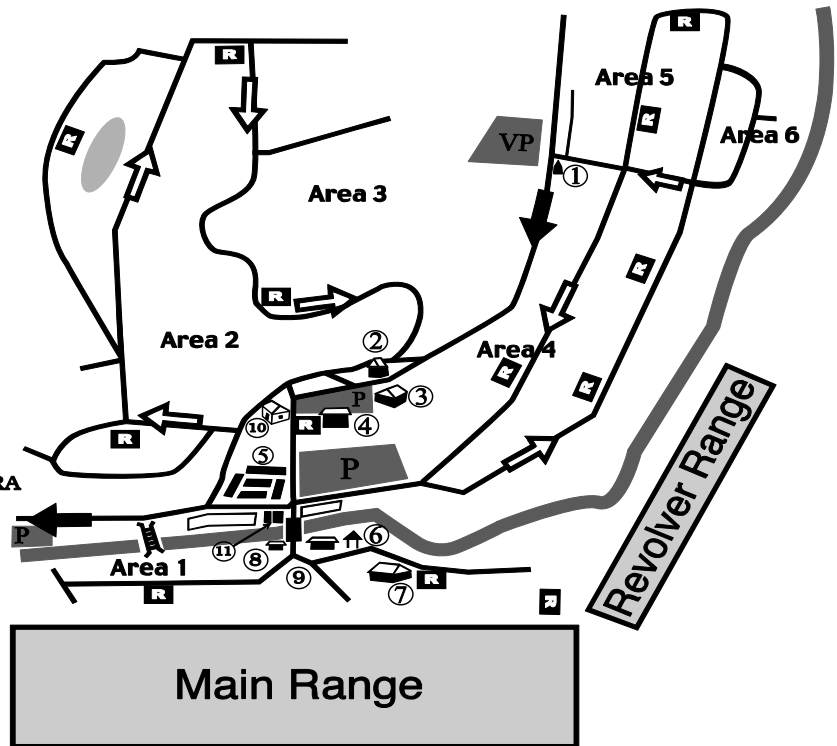
Fort Shenandoah ♦ Winchester, Virginia
